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August 2017 Summary:

The month of August was uncomfortably hot and humid. Most of the shower activity was attributed to low level troughs. tropical waves coupled with the Inter- Tropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ). Total monthly recorded rainfall at the Argyle International Airport (A.I.A) was 25° N 222.1mm. The highest daily recorded rainfall was 80.9mm on the 3rd from a tropical wave coupled with the ITCZ. A flood watch was issued. A tropical storm warning was issued for S.V.G on August 17th for Tropical Storm Harvey.

Twenty-four hours recorded rainfall at A.I.A was 66.9mm. Flooding was reported on the Grenadine Islands of Bequia and Mustique along with a few landslides on mainland. Highest monthly rainfall was 474mm recorded in Convent (see figure 1). Moderate to occasionally fresh winds were observed during the month, with maximum gusts in the Argyle area occurring on the $18^{\rm th}$ as 27 knots (~ 50 km/h). Generally moderate swells were experienced in open waters, with above normal seas being agitated by occasional strong breezes prompting the issuance of advisories and warnings.

Temperature Outlook:

Air Temperature - Above normal to normal Sea Surface Temperature ~0.5°C-1.5°C above average




Figure 2. Regional Precipitation Outlook September-October-November 2017 Read more

National Rainfall Outlook: (See figure 2.) September - November 2017: Normal to above normal

Temperatures, both night and day are forecast to be likely warmer than usual for the upcoming October month. Therefore, discomfort can peak due to the combination of very warm temperatures and high humidity. Heat waves and heat stress are likely and enhanced health risk is expected due to unfavorable environmental conditions. Meanwhile, above-average Atlantic hurricane activity is still forecast.
